In spite of how we may feel though, it is still a great idea to focus on the One who watches over us every minute of our lives.

For the past few months, I have been making a habit of riding my bike in the early mornings a few times a week and I start when it is dark. Elaine starts her riding about an hour later and we meet up on the way. This is one way we are taking positive steps to take care of ourselves during this challenging time. A few days ago, I had a bike accident where my tires slipped on wet pine needles. Fortunately, I was on a concrete bike trail so no cars were involved. Which made me think and appreciate the verses above concerning God's protection. We don't often think about what is really going on in the heavenly realms regarding God looking out for our well being but there are many biblical verses which talk about his angels looking out for us. (Matthew 18:10, Psalm 34:7, Hebrews 1:14, Luke 4:10)

Elaine and I were encouraged and reminded of the very real and special promises of a loving Father that takes care of His children in all situations. He desires so many more to become a part of His family and gives us all a mission to take His love to this very hurting world. In the light of the pandemic and global turmoil, have you thought about the people around you who don't belong to this family and the very real fear they must be experiencing right now? Or perhaps you know some of God's children who need to be reminded like Elaine and I were? We all need to lift our eyes and be reminded that God is in control, He still loves people deeply and desires them to know Him.
