David and I drove straight to the hospital ICU and got to see Louis and talk with him. He seemed in good spirits and we had a great visit. Elaine, her mom and sister spent every day for the next nine days with him but he went steadily downhill. At one point Elaine asked her daddy if he was ready to meet Jesus soon and he said, "Yes I am. I've been waiting to see him for a long time. And I will be waiting to see you all over there when you get there too."

Louis was a very strong man who fought the good fight and never gave up until Jesus ushered him into the kingdom. His life, his wit, his sense of humor is being missed but he does not have pain or weakness anymore and the way he left us was an encouragement to us all. Elaine is still with her mom helping her adjust and trying to figure out next steps on her living situation so I am sure you know how to pray for her.



It stirred my heart to hear the kneeling soldier say "on behalf of a grateful nation, please accept this flag as a symbol of our appreciation for your loved one's honorable and faithful service.""

We are taking a family vacation in Colorado next week and after that, Elaine and April and Westley will return to Orlando while I go to our staff conference in Milwaukee. Immediately after that, I have been asked to attend our African leadership conference in Senegal. I am really looking forward to that. Pray I can be an encouragement to our leaders there and that God will give me wisdom in conversations when the need arises.

Thank you so much for praying for us. Please continue to pray for Elaine especially as she and her sister help her mother adjust to living without her partner of seventy-two years. Also for us all while we are apart.

I am blessed to have spent a bit of time with Louis before Jesus took him home. His heart preparation was amazing and reminded me of the Apostle Paul's last words to Timothy. When I became a believer fifty-five years ago those words were some of the first words I read in my own study of Scripture. It made everything seem so real and life on earth indeed, temporal. They inspired me to live my life for Jesus. I pray for each of us that they are words we can say when our time here is at an end. We have fought the good fight, we have finished the race, we have kept the faith.
